Just twenty minutes from both Tuscany and Latium, Orvieto rises majestically from a tuff cliff, a breathtaking landmark that captures the eye of every traveler journeying between Florence and Rome.


But Orvieto is only the beginning. Umbria, the green heart of Italy, unfolds beyond it with rolling hills, medieval towns, timeless traditions, and a pace of life that invites you to slow down and explore.



DISCOVER ORVIETO

Explore the rich history and hidden gems of this hilltop town with a professional guide:

- The Duomo of Orvieto: admire the radiant gilded façade of one of Italy's most extraordinary Gothic cathedrals, celebrated as the Giglio d'Oro.
- Chapel of the Holy Corporal & San Brizio Chapel: within the Duomo lies Luca Signorelli's dramatic fresco cycle The Last Judgment, a masterpiece that profoundly influenced Michelangelo's work in the Sistine Chapel.
- The Medieval Quarter: stroll through one of Orvieto's most authentic neighborhoods, home to San Giovenale Church, the city's oldest sacred building, dating back to the early 11th century.
- Torre del Moro (Clock Tower): rising from the historic center since the 13th century, the tower offers a privileged panoramic view over the rooftops of Orvieto and the rolling Umbrian landscape beyond.
- Enchanting Old Town Alleys: lose yourself in a maze of elegant stone lanes, where centuries of history unfold amid artisan workshops and refined local atmospheres.
- St. Patrick's Well: a Renaissance marvel of engineering by Antonio da Sangallo the Younger, descending 62 meters into the rock. Its twin, opposing spiral staircases of 248 steps each.
- Orvieto Underground: access a hidden world beneath the city: a network of caves and passageways revealing layers of Etruscan, Medieval, and Renaissance life.
- Etruscan Necropolis of Crocifisso del Tufo: a preserved necropolis from the 6th–5th centuries BC, offering an intimate encounter with Orvieto's ancient and aristocratic past.



In the immediate surrounding and further afield

- **Civita di Bagnoregio**, perched on a hill of volcanic rock and reachable only by a narrow pedestrian bridge is known as “the dying town,” it is famous for its dramatic landscape, ancient stone houses, and timeless atmosphere
- **Bolsena Lake** is the largest volcanic lake in Europe, near the town of Bolsena, it is surrounded by gentle hills and historic villages, clear waters and peaceful natural beauty
- **Todi**: overlooking the Tiber Valley, is known for its medieval charm, elegant piazzas such as Piazza del Popolo, and a quiet, authentic Umbrian atmosphere. Visitors can admire the Church of Santa Maria della Consolazione, a masterpiece of Renaissance architecture, explore Todi's gothic and roman cathedral.



- **Perugia**: the main city of Umbria region, among its medieval architecture, offers stunning views over the Umbrian countryside and is famous for its art, lively festivals, and is also famous worldwide for its exquisite chocolate, including the iconic Baci.
- **Assisi**, a UNESCO site, is celebrated as the birthplace of St. Francis and for its magnificent basilica, which houses frescoes by Giotto and Cimabue. Among its treasures, La Porziuncola, the small chapel within the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, where St. Francis founded the Franciscan order and began his life of devotion.
- **Spello**, a flower-filled village with Roman roots, famous for its stone houses, colorful balconies, and some of the most picturesque streets in Umbria
- **Marmore Waterfalls**, a spectacular artificial waterfall near Terni, it plunges 165 meters in three drops, making it one of the tallest waterfalls in Europe. Surrounded by lush nature, famous for its water releases and scenic hiking paths





Gastronomy & Local Flavors

- **Lumachelle orvietane:** traditional savory rolls from Orvieto, flavored with pork, lard, and spices
- **Umbrichelli:** thick handmade pasta typical of Umbria, usually served with simple, robust sauces
- **Torta al testo:** flatbread cooked on a stone griddle, often filled with cured meats or cheese
- **Tozzetti:** crunchy almond biscuits, traditionally enjoyed with dessert wine
- **Truffle,** that can elevate so many dishes
- **Porchetta:** slow-roasted pork seasoned with herbs, famous for its crispy skin and juicy meat


