Visit the exquisite Borromean Islands: like a fleet of fine vessels, they lie at anchor at the Golfo Borromeo, between Stresa and Verbania. Of the three visitable islands, **Isola Bella** is undoubtedly the most striking: the Borromean Palace is impressively baroque, displaying numerous artworks and amazing, majestic gardens. **Isola Madre** is home to another palazzo and a luxuriant, less formal garden, a triumph of colours in the blooming season. Further north on the west bank, late 19th c. **Villa Taranto** and its splendid grounds are among Lake Maggiore's most imposing highlights: the Normandy-style villa was bought by a Scottish captain, Neil McEacharn, after spotting an advert in The Times in 1931. Some 20,000 plants were added over thirty years and the site is considered one of Europe's finest botanic gardens. **Parco Pallavicino** gives you the chance to spend an unforgettable day among paths in bloom, centuries-old trees, a stunning botanic garden and numerous species of mammals and exotic birds.



ISOLA DI SAN GIULIO



➤➤ Deep blue waters, reticent beauty and an intriguing island: Lago d'Orta, known as "Cinderella" by the locals, epitomises charm and captivating tranquillity. About 23 km (30minutes) from Stresa (Lake Maggiore), this little gem sits in one of the most fascinating corners of northwest Italy. Quintessentially fairy tale Piedmont.

The way mountains, weather and light are forever in counterpoint to the water itself is striking; whether it's the enchanting autumn light or the crisp early spring mornings, this lake has an ace up its sleeve any time of the year. Overlooking the forest-lined banks of the shimmering lake, **Orta San Giulio** is a romantic little village where narrow cobbled streets run between pastel-washed houses and palaces with elaborate iron-wrought balconies. Built on the slopes of a steep hill, tourists fill its alleyways at weekends in the spring and summer months, while it gets quieter in the evenings. 294m above sea level, the village boasts a wonderful position. The view from its central Piazza Motta directly onto the lake and the

Isola di San Giulio is simply breathtaking. The island of silence is, well and truly, more than a lovely definition: a small path runs along the island and it is called, in fact, the **Way of Silence**.

The island hosts a convent, as well, where eighty nuns live.

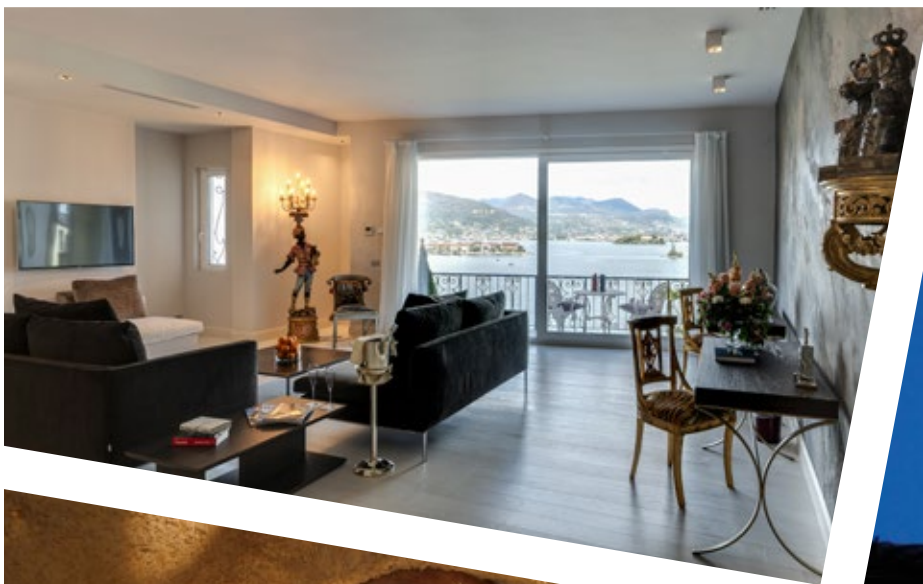

The beauty of this area in northwestern Tuscany is the juxtaposition of mountains and the sea, rolling hills and medieval towns. All this majestic scenery can be contemplated by the wild and remote **Apuan Alps** soaring high and well visible from the coast. **Carrara** is the largest source of marble in the world and the place where you can sense history happening. The marble blocks for the Pietà of Michelangelo (Saint Peter's, Rome) comes from here. Head to **Pietrasanta**, also known as Little Athens, thanks to the concentration of artists who have decided to settle here. Among the best known in decades are Igor Mitoraj and Fernando Botero. **Forte dei Marmi** is an attractive resort where trendy shops and antiques fair, as well as music festivals, attract many visitors, who enjoy the beauty of the sea in a unique setting.

>> Quaint, picturesque, scenic and pretty: **Lucca** has it all. Walk along fashionable Via Fillungo, with its series of trendy shops, before reaching sublime Piazza Anfiteatro, perhaps Tuscany's loveliest square, named after an amphitheatre that stood here in Roman times. **Pisa** and its leaning tower are so famous that you may be tempted to glance at the **Campo dei Miracoli** and move on; you should, instead, visit the epic Camposanto, the cemetery that was sadly heavily bombed during WWII and bestows an air of serenity and calm in an otherwise busy corner of the city. The Baptistery and the 11th c. Duomo are worth a visit. Further south, **Bolgheri** is famous for its epic cypress avenue and for the production of delicious Sassicaia.

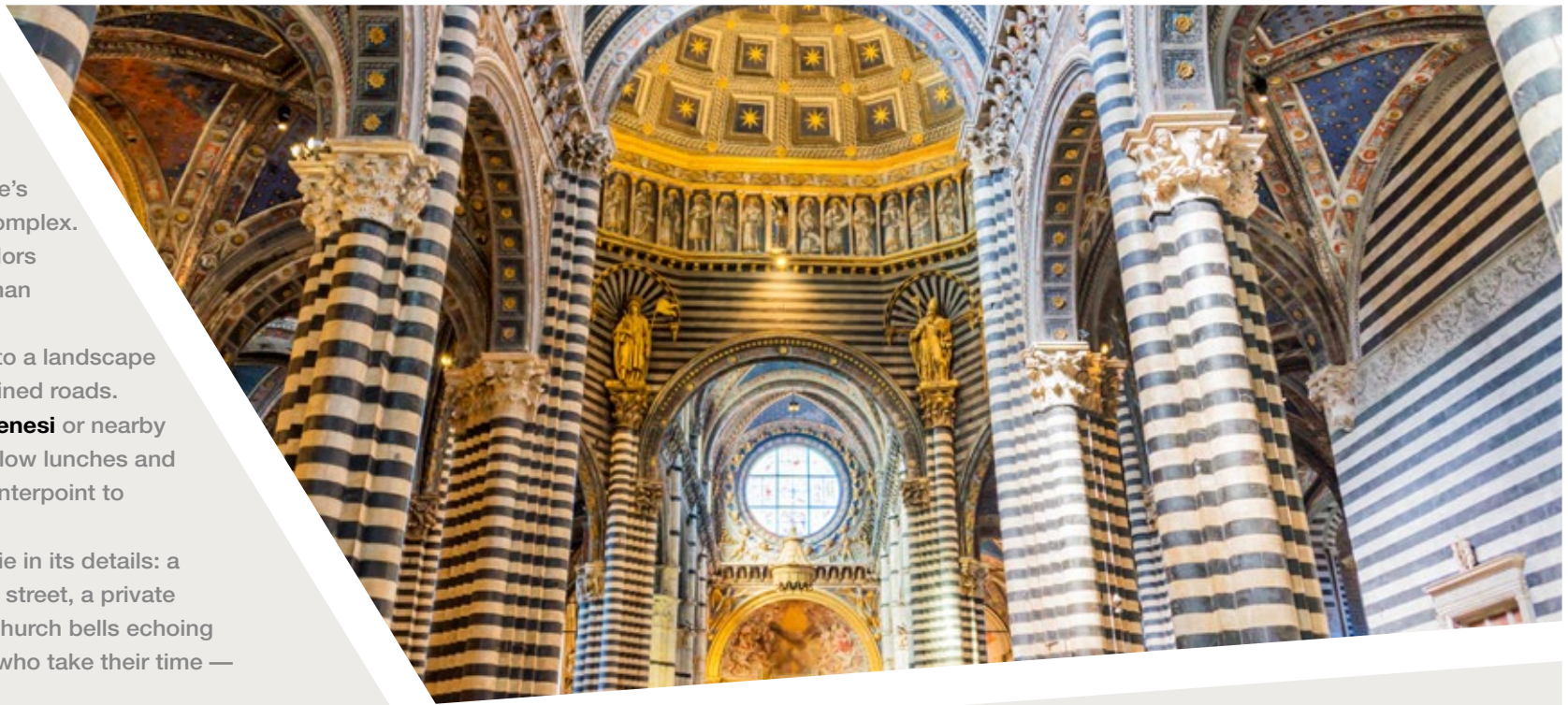
Siena is not simply a destination — it is an experience to be lived slowly, with curiosity and reverence, revealing layers of history, ritual and timeless beauty.

Begin in **Piazza del Campo**, one of Europe's most extraordinary medieval squares. Its shell-shaped design invites you to pause, sit, and absorb the rhythm of local life. Twice a year, the square becomes the stage for the legendary **Palio di Siena**, a visceral and deeply emotional horse race that embodies centuries of rivalry, pride and tradition among the city's contrade.

A visit to the **Duomo di Siena** is essential. This Gothic masterpiece surprises at every turn — from its striped marble façade to the breathtaking interior adorned with works by Michelangelo, Donatello and Pinturicchio. Do not miss the inlaid marble floor, revealed only at certain times of the year, a true work of art beneath your feet.



➤ Step into Siena's quieter soul at **Santa Maria della Scala**, one of Europe's oldest hospitals, now a vast cultural complex. Here, frescoed halls and ancient corridors tell stories of care, pilgrimage and human connection that span centuries. Beyond the city walls, Siena opens onto a landscape of rolling hills, vineyards and cypress-lined roads. A countryside escape into the **Crete Senesi** or nearby wine estates offers intimate tastings, slow lunches and unforgettable views — the perfect counterpoint to the city's artistic intensity. Siena's most meaningful experiences lie in its details: a coffee enjoyed overlooking a medieval street, a private guided visit after hours, the sound of church bells echoing at dusk. It is a city that rewards those who take their time — refined, authentic and deeply moving.

ORVIETO



>> The UNESCO classified towns of **Assisi** and **Orvieto** are the undisputed starlets of the region. Visit the outstanding **Duomo of Orvieto** that brings together many eras and architectural styles. Descend the 200 steps into **St Patrick's Well** (Pozzo di San Patrizio), 53m-deep (174ft), it was commissioned by Pope Clement VII during the Sack of Rome and built between 1527 and 1537. **Assisi** is the home of Saint Francis, the founder of the Franciscan order. Visit the Saint Francis Basilica decorated with exquisite frescoes and the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli with the famous *La Porziuncola*. Enjoy a walk into the historic center of **Spello** to get a real medieval vibe, only 10KM (6.2 miles) from Assisi. Head to the medieval town of **Todi** and visit the Church of Saint Mary of Consolation which is considered one of the symbolic buildings of Renaissance architecture, the Todi's Gothic Cathedral and have an aperitivo in Piazza del Popolo. **Perugia** is the capital of Umbria, the largest city in the region and a walk into the historic center is a must. With so many incredible places to explore, nature to see, and several experiences to enjoy - you will surely have a wonderful time in Umbria.

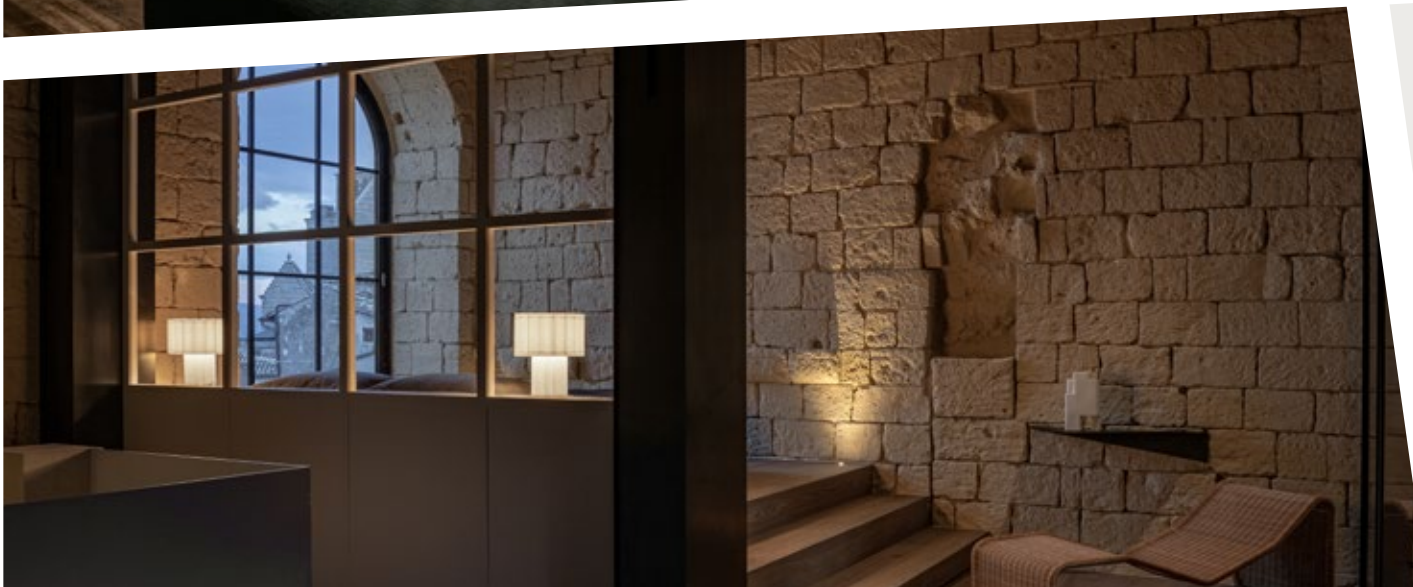
